CLEMATIS

PRUNING CLEMATIS

Group A: Early flowering Clematis. Prune these back as soon as possible after bloom, but no later than the end of July. This allows time for new growth to produce flower buds for next season. Remove shoots that have bloomed. Do not cut into woody trunks.

Group B: Large-flowered Hybrids. Large-flowered hybrids boom in mid-June on short stems from previous season's growth and often again in late summer on new growth. Prune Feb or March by removing dead and weak stems, the cut back remaining stems to the topmost pair of large, plump green buds. This cut could be a few inches to a foot or two from the stem tips. You may be able to force a flush of new growth from the base by cutting the vine back to 18" immediately after the flush of bloom June.

Group C: Late-flowering Clematis. Plants in this group flower on the last two to three feet of the current season's growth. Some types begin blooming in mid-June and continue into fall. This is the easiest group to prune since no old wood needs to be maintained. In Feb or March cut each stem to a height of about two to three feet.




